


AGRICULTURAL ASSISTANCE

The Lucas SWCD services the agricultural sector of the county by offering assistance programs, informational workshops, and technical insight regarding implementing best management practices (BMPs) on the farm. Our staff also manages a demonstration farm at Blue Creek Conservation Area (BCCA) in Whitehouse, Ohio where we showcase conservation farming. We are also involved in facilitating ditch maintenance projects throughout the county.

In 2018, the Lucas SWCD was awarded a grant to assist in purchasing a soil health education trailer. It is equipped with a rainfall simulator that compares infiltration and runoff rates for different soil types and management practices.


