2023 Lucas SWCD Board of Supervisors Election Legal Notice and Voting Procedures



Election Period: October 10 - November 8

The Ohio Soil and Water Conservation Commission will cause an election of Supervisors for the Lucas Soil and Water Conservation District to be held in accordance with Chapter 940 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Two Supervisors will be elected to three-year terms beginning January 1, 2024 and ending December 31, 2026. The candidates are Kevin Joyce, Jim Vogelbacher and Bill Wolf. Anyone interested in self-nominating for the election must collect 10 valid signatures on the appropriate form (found at LucasSWCD.org/election) and return it by 4:30 PM on September 5th to the District. Eligible voters include all owners and occupiers of land at least 18 years of age or older within Lucas County. All eligible voters must certify their status by signature on the ballot application.

Beginning October 10, 2023, eligible voters can either vote in-person or absentee:

- To vote in-person, please visit the Lucas SWCD office during normal business hours between October 10th and 12:00 PM on November 8th, or at our Annual Meeting from 4:30 to 5:30 PM at The Chalet in Oak Shade Grove in Oregon.
- To request an absentee ballot, choose one of the following methods:

 - Mail a request via the postal service to 3350 Hill Ave., Suite K, Toledo OH 43607

The election designee of the Lucas SWCD will then mail the ballot application, election ballot and return envelope to the person making the absentee request. The sealed ballot and ballot application must be returned to the Lucas SWCD office by 3:00 PM on November 8, 2023. All absentee ballots must be sealed in the return envelope provided.

Meet the Candidates



Bill Wolf spent his 37 year career in agri-business as a commodity trader and most recently as president of The Andersons plant nutrient group. He officially retired in 2018. Bill is a commissioner on the Ohio Lake Erie Commission and is a member of the International Joint Commission collaborative dealing with Lake Erie water quality issues. He is also an Ohio Certified Volunteer Naturalist for Metroparks Toledo. Bill and his wife, Kate, have lived in Lucas County for over 15 years.



Jim Vogelbacher, a Lucas SWCD Board Supervisor since 2017, is a life-long farmer in Jerusalem Township, producing corn, soybeans, wheat, and hay. Jim has included many conservation practices on his farm, including no-till, CRP, filter strips, and variable rate technology (VRT). His efforts earned him the award of Lucas SWCD Cooperator of the Year in 1997. Jim is also retired from 32 years of service at Toledo Edison. He has been married to his wife Mona for 49 years and has 3 grown children. Jim would like to continue to serve the Lucas SWCD by promoting the conservation and appreciation of our unique soil and water resources in Lucas County.



Kevin Joyce, a Lucas SWCD Board Supervisor since 2021, gained extensive experience in conservation and farmland preservation as Executive Director of Black Swamp Conservancy and Ohio Project Manager with The Trust for Public Land. He also was on the steering committee of the Coalition of Ohio Land Trusts. Kevin has been a member of the Natural Resources Assistance Council of Lucas County for 13 years. He has lived in Lucas County for over 40 years and has a law degree from the University of Toledo, a master's degree from Bowling Green State University - College of Business and a bachelor's degree in biology from Case Western Reserve University. His wife is a Registered Nurse and they have two adult daughters. Kevin became interested in serving on the Lucas SWCD Board after working successfully with several NW Ohio SWCDs while at the Black Swamp Conservancy.

Putting the Garden to Bed

Didn't we just say hello to spring? It's hard to believe that fall is approaching and soon it will be time for you to put your vegetable garden to bed for the winter. Below are a few ways you can do that while also improving your likelihood of success for next year's crop.

- <u>Weeds:</u> This would be the time to make sure you have removed your weeds, roots and all, if you haven't already. You don't want thousands of tiny seeds to plant themselves and start popping up later.
- Removing Spent Plants: Harvest the last of your produce and then remove the old, spent plants. You can either: pull each and every plant out by the roots, shake off the soil, and compost it. Or you can cut the plants off at soil level, compost the tops, and leave the roots in the ground. The belief is that the roots will help hold soil in place while adding nutrients to the soil as they decompose; this works especially well if the plant is a nitrogen fixing legume. In either situation, if a plant was diseased or severely infested, it should not be composted or left in the garden but should instead be disposed of in the trash.
- <u>Cover the Soil:</u> Never leave the ground bare. You can plant a winter cover crop after harvest or lay down a thick layer of organic material or even unfinished compost. During the winter and early spring, the organic material will slowly break down and add nutrients back to the soil.
- <u>Take Notes:</u> Draw a map of your garden to help you with crop rotation next year. Also, write down your problems and successes to review when you are planning next year's garden.

An aerator truck from Fender's Fish Hatchery will distribute pre-ordered fish fingerlings on <u>Thursday, October 12, 2023,</u> from <u>10:30 - 11:30 AM</u> at the <u>Lucas County Fairgrounds</u> in Maumee. Your order must be picked up during this time or it will be forfeited.

Each fish is priced between \$0.11 and \$1.08. Also available is an all-natural pond conditioner, in 1-gallon and 5-gallon amounts, that uses naturally-occurring beneficial bacteria, plant extracts, enzyme blends and a food-grade dye that creates clean, healthy ponds; reduces pond sludge/muck; improves water quality for fish; and enhances the natural color of the water. Fathead Minnows should be stocked at 1,000 per acre pond.

The Lucas SWCD no longer sells Grass Carp (White Amur) as they are not native to Ohio and pose a risk of becoming an invasive species that alters natural ecosystems.



Fall 2023 Cover Crop Sale - Orders due September 29th

We are offering two cover crop seed mixes this Fall for use in your garden that are well-suited for NW Ohio. Planting a cover crop after harvest protects your soil through fall and winter and also rejuvenates the soil and improves water infiltration. Once it is time to plant next spring, mow, mulch or clip the cover crop -- you can even leave some of the cover crop residue for weed suppression and moisture retention!

Garden Late Cover Mix

A simple cover crop mix designed to plant with a minimal window and still provide the benefits of a cover crop. Plant up until late October for Zone 6. This mix contains cereal rye, crimson clover, and hairy vetch. It is winter-hardy and will continue growth in spring. Mow, mulch, or clip live plants in late spring. Tilling is not recommended.



Austrian Winter Pea

This legume is quick growing and an excellent source of nitrogen for your garden. Sow seeds through late October to have the plants come up in early spring. Spring flowers provide food for pollinators and the shoots are edible! Mow, mulch, or clip live plants in late spring. Tilling is not recommended.

Seeds will be available for pick-up at the LSWCD office -- you will be notified when ready!

H2Ohio Phosphorus Reduction Program in Lucas County



Farmers participating in the H2Ohio Phosphorus Reduction Program are currently underway in the final year of their original contracts, though a new iteration of the program will be available for sign-up later this Fall. This new version of the program is intended to be more stream-lined and simplified. If you are interested in signing up or continuing with the H2Ohio program, please make sure you have your soil tests and nutrient management plans up to date. Contact me to learn more about the H2Ohio program and to be placed on a waitlist to enroll into the program once sign-up opens this Fall. A summary of the total acres completed in Lucas County for Crop Year 2022 can be seen below. We are pleased to note that last year saw a 133% increase in the acres established for Overwintering Cover Crops!

<u>Upcoming H2Ohio Program Updates</u>

The Best Management Practices (BMPs) included in the new version of the H2Ohio Phosphorus Reduction Program have been modified to better suit the needs of producers. A voluntary nutrient management plan is required for all cropland enrolled in H2Ohio. See the updated BMPs in the table to the right. Call me at (419) 377-0901 to learn more.

The Hazardous Waste Prevention and Cleanup Enviroscape illustrates issues arising from improper discharge and disposal or accidental spills of hazardous materials along with methods to cleanup and prevent such spills. Sources that are discussed include underground storage tanks, illegal dumping, and household/commercial practices. The Wetlands Enviroscape demonstrates the characteristics/functions of wetlands and the many services they provide to control erosion and pollution.
