

Type of Pollution

Contact

If you see a spill or illegal dumping that poses an **immediate** and **significant threat** to public health and/or the environment, for example:

- Dead fish in a stream
- Black water flowing from a pipe
- Oil on the surface of a waterway

If you have a non-emergency pollution complaint regarding manure and/or fertilizer, for example:

- Manure and/or fertilizer piled next to a stream or ditch
- Manure and/or fertilizer being spread on frozen, wet, or snow-covered ground

If you see flow from a storm outfall or ditch with unusual color or strong odor or someone dumping a pollutant down a storm drain or directly into a waterway, obtain a license plate number or address and call...

If you see an improperly managed or ruptured septic system, call...
